Think about reconfiguring your space with the same furniture for different programming possibilities. Ample storage allows you to put away pieces of furniture that are not in use and is crucial to the flexibility of the space. Ise lightweight stacking chairs to host lecture-style programming. Arrange comfortable lounge seating into a group around small tables to foster conversation-style programming.
